

# CONSTRAINT-INDUCED MOVEMENT THERAPY CAMP

Constraint Induced Movement Therapy (CIMT)  
is a therapy designed to specifically treat  
“learned non-use” of the affected arm.

CIMT involves constraining the less affected arm using a mitt while providing simultaneous intensive practice of movements in the hemiplegic arm. Those who have had a stroke, cerebral palsy or brachial plexus injuries would most benefit from this camp.

Ages: Birth through 12 years old  
Cost for Camp: \$200/day or  
1 Visit per day billed to insurance for Physical Therapy and  
1 Visit per day billed to insurance for Occupational Therapy  
There is a 2 week minimum
